In Joy & Sorrow ...

Pondering Together the Treasures of our Faith

January 18-25 marks the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Of worthy note in 2017 is that the Christian Church is remembering the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. You will recall that on October 31, 1517, the Augustinian monk, Fr. Martin Luther, nailed his 95 Theses to the main door of the Catholic Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Some historians are not absolutely sure that Luther used a hammer and nails to physically nail a piece of paper to the church door. That may be a bit of a legend. Martin Luther had legitimate concerns about the Catholic Church, especially the fact that exorbitant money was being collected from repentant sinners. money which was being used to help build Saint Peter's Basilica. He thought it scandalous that sinners were being convinced that they could shorten their anticipated stay in purgatory by making a hefty donation. He discouraged and even condemned this buying of indulgences.

Five hundred years ago, the Catholic Church was fractured into the Christian denominations that are still present in our communities today: Lutheran, Baptist, Methodist, Episcopalian (or Anglican throughout the rest of the world), Presbyterian, United Church of Christ, Assembly of God, and the evangelical communities too many to be named. Our own Alliance Church in Appleton would be one of these evangelical communities.

I believe that Jesus was very sincere in giving us his last Will and Testament, if you will, on the night before he was to suffer, at the Last Supper, as found in Chapters 14-17 in the Gospel of John. Jesus' heartfelt prayer in those final comments to his closest friends was that "they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you." (17.21) Jesus is still patiently waiting for his dream of unity among all Christians to be realized.

Since the Decree on Ecumenism, which was promulgated at the Second Vatican Council (1962-65), we Catholics have worked hard with our Protestant sisters and brothers to move forward together, although there have been periods where we have seemed to stall in our desire to do so.

I think this is the "gist" of the Decree on Ecumenism:

All in the Church must preserve unity in essentials. But let all, according to the gifts they have received enjoy a proper freedom, in their various forms of spiritual life and discipline, in their different liturgical rites, and even in their theological elaborations of revealed truth. In all things let charity prevail. If they are true to this course of action, they will be giving even better expression to the authentic catholicity and apostolicity of the Church. On the other hand, Catholics must gladly acknowledge and esteem the truly Christian endowments from our common heritage which are to be found among our

separated brethren. It is right and salutary to recognize the riches of Christ and virtuous works in the lives of others who are bearing witness to Christ, sometimes even to the shedding of their blood. For God is always wonderful in His works and worthy of all praise. (taken from section 4 of the document)

Let us join hands with all of our Christian sisters and brothers and do good together. It is in this circle of humble service for the poor that we will move closer to one another as together we move towards Jesus, the Lord, who is always at the center of all of our lives.

The ecumenical prayer service hosted by Saint Joseph Parish this past Thanksgiving Eve was a beautiful experience of Christian sisters and brothers coming together to give praise and thanks to God. Hopefully, this experience can happen again on Thanksgiving Eve 2017! Father Bill +


