IN JOY & SORROW

Pondering Together the Treasures of Our Faith

It is truly virtuous to greet the gift of each new day with a spirit of anticipation and joy. We have captured that virtue in popular sayings like: "the early bird gets the worm", "carpe diem (seize the day)", "a stitch in time saves nine", and "don't let the grass grow under your feet." Perhaps you can think of some other sayings that convey this sentiment that every moment is precious and presents an opportunity.

My Dad's favorite saying along these lines was "up and at 'em." This is actually a hybrid, I guess, of Get up! and Get at them!, referring to the military, with the full command being Up, Guards, attack them! Now this is not what my Dad meant!

"Up and at 'em" was our Dad's greeting to us kids at the beginning of a new day. He usually boomed it, opening our bedroom door, while we tried to ignore this way-too-early-in-the-morning wake-up call. He was saying, "Get up and start moving."

My dad was a hard worker who was always conscientious, reliable, responsible, and honest. For nearly fifty years, he built homes throughout Neenah and Menasha, which to this day stand as a tribute to his dedication. He was always excited to get up and go to work each morning. He took great pride in his craft.

On Father's Day, we give thanks for the gift of our fathers. We take to heart with genuine love and appreciation their dedication to raising us and providing all the best for us. We are grateful for all the time they spend with us and for the joy for living that they share with us.

Of all the words Jesus spoke, the most shocking was the single word "Abba", which he used to refer to His Father in heaven. Jesus' audience would have been scandalized by such an informal address. For the Jewish people of his time, the name of God was so sacred that it was never said out loud. In the Hebrew Scriptures, when Moses asked the Lord what his name was so that Moses could tell the Egyptian pharaoh who was refusing to release the enslaved Israelites people, the Lord God replied, "I am who I am." Kind of an interesting name, wouldn't you say?

In Hebrew, this most sacred name is always written with the vowels missing. In Hebrew, God's name is YHWH. In the text of our Bibles today, when ever this sacred name is mentioned, it appears as LORD. So for Jesus to refer to God as Abba, which is the equivalent of our Daddy or Papa, is pretty mind-boggling. Yet, this is the kind of relationship God wants to have with God's daughters and sons. It is an intimate, close, and tender relationship.

In Fr. Richard Rohr's The Divine Dance: The Trinity and Your Transformation, Father Rohr puts it this way: "Don't think that this metaphor Father is trying to ascribe gender to God. God is not masculine. That's not the point. It simply became the classic term because Abba is the word that Jesus used to connote safety and endearment...But unfortunately, it suffers today from being heard (and used) inside patriarchal cultures, implicitly validating a hierarchical worldview. The Abba-Father of Jesus, by contrast, is much more moving inside a circle that at the top of a pyramid. [Sister Sandra Schneiders suggests] that Jesus probably had to come in a male body to undo any patriarchal notion of God from the inside out."

If you are intrigued just a little bit, I would recommend you read The Divine Dance. It is filled with many intriguing thoughts that are worthy of being chewed upon! Happy Father's Day! Father Bill +
