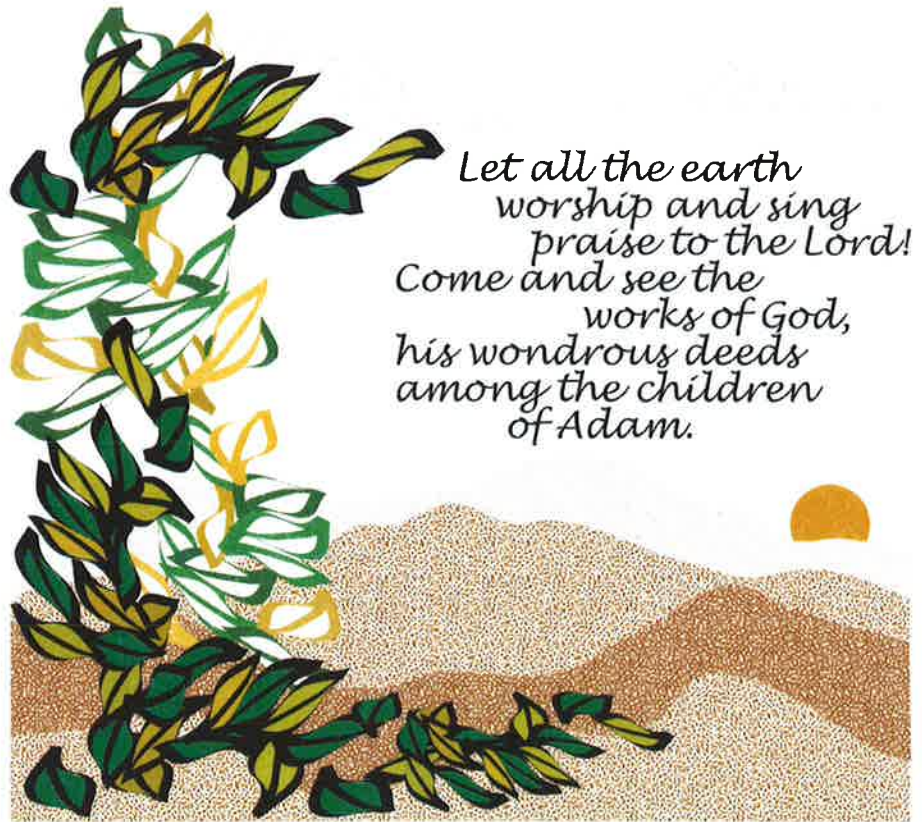

In Joy and Sorrow PONDERING TOGETHER THE TREASURES OF OUR FAITH

In the face of brutal and senseless tragedy, sometimes fueled by hatred of the few, there is the loving and self-giving sacrifice in the responses of so many other people. We witnessed the beauty of this generous response in the aftermaths of 9-11, Hurricane Katrina, and now Orlando, and on so many other occasions. These stories of unselfish and heroic love are always an inspiration to me.

I want to share one recent story from flight attendant Kelly Davis Karas. On a recent JetBlue flight, originating from I don't where, but destined for Orlando, was 20-year-old shooting victim Luis Omar Ocasio-Capo's grandmother. She was going home to be with her family. Kelly writes:

Knowing she was making this hard journey alone, JetBlue employees made sure to be at her side every step of the way. She was greeted at the jet way with a wheelchair. Melinda [Kelly's fellow flight attendant] and I helped her get settled into her seat, gave her a blanket, a pillow, a box of tissues, and water so she could be as comfortable as possible.

Grandma was understandably distraught, but met us with kindness, gentleness, and gratitude. I had the idea to pass around a piece of paper to everyone on board and invite them to sign it for this grieving grandmother. I talked it over with Melinda and she started the process from the back of the plane. As we took beverage orders, we whispered a heads up about the plan



as we went. Halfway through, Melinda called me, "Kel, I think you should start another paper from the front. Folks are writing PARAGRAPHS." So I did. Then we started in the middle. Lastly, running out of time on our hour and fifteen-minute flight, we handed out pieces of paper to everyone still waiting. When we gathered them together to present to Grandma, we didn't just have a sheet of paper covered in

names, which is what I had envisioned. Instead, we had page after page after page of long messages offering condolences, peace, love and support. There were even a couple of cash donations, and more than a few tears. That isn't where the kindness stopped. Passengers still wanted to offer the grandmother more support, even if it meant taking more time to vacate after landing. When we landed, I made an announcement that the company had emailed to us earlier in the morning to use an optional addition to our normal landing announcement, which states, "JetBlue stands with Orlando." Then with grandma's permission and at the request of a couple of passengers, we offered a moment of silence in Omar's memory.

In President Obama's remarks in Orlando on Thursday, June 16, he recalled something one of the doctors said who treated the wounded that horrifying early Sunday morning, "After the worst of humanity reared its evil head, the best of humanity came roaring back." The President went on to say, "Here in Orlando, in the men and women taken from us, those who loved them, we see some of the true character of this country - the best of humanity coming roaring back; the love and compassion and the fierce resolve that will carry us not just through this atrocity, but through whatever difficult times may confront us."

Please join me in continuing to pray for those young people who lost their lives in Orlando. Let us continue to look into our hearts to ask ourselves how we treat one another.
