





In my first article, I asked if anyone knew the ending of the famous song from which I took the above title. (The answer was Swing!) I shared how the history of liturgical and sacred music in the Catholic Church actually crossed over into many "styles" from chant to contemporary Catholic and Christian songs. This became even more relevant at Jeannette Piette's funeral liturgy last Saturday. Many of you may remember that Jeannette was a "Southern lady" with roots deep in Louisiana! Those of you who attended were probably quite surprised to hear a Dixieland Jazz band play Dixie and When The Saints Go Marching In to conclude the liturgy. I knew that many people would be surprised by the Dixieland band "style" but more important to me was how the funeral liturgy was enhanced by that musical style. How did including that music style enhance the liturgy and what did the people that attended the funeral bring to the liturgy themselves to make it meaningful for them? In this article I am offering my thoughts on how "liturgy" is made relevant to us as a "believer".

First, what is "Liturgy"? Michael Raia, writing in Catholic Liturgy 101: Introduction to Liturgical Catechesis states that 'Liturgy' is public worshipthe work of Christ and that of the Church, the Body of Christ. As with any sacrament, the action or "doing" is all God's, but Liturgy is an "action" of the whole Christ (CCC 1136). Raia continues to state that we should be mindful that every action is part of our liturgical worship. We should sing along when appropriate, listen attentively to the readings and homily, pray earnestly with the prayers, and maintain an engaged and reverent posture. We are all members of the Body of Christ in the Liturgy, and the extent to which the liturgy transforms us, depends on our own choice to engage and cooperate with God's grace, or tune Him out (pun intended!). The CCC states "In the New Testament the word 'liturgy' refers not only to the celebration of divine worship but also to the proclamation of the Gospel and to active charity" (# 1069). The natural action at the close of the

Liturgy is directed outward towards the service to which we are called by our baptism (ite missa est) and to "go forth". The liturgy is missionary in purpose. In addition to glorifying God, it sanctifies us and calls us to love one another and serve those in need as Christ commanded.

Deacon Gerry's homily this past weekend helped me think about how our Liturgy serves us as a missionary people of God. I thought his question to us was particularly challenging. Do we really believe in what we say we believe or are they just words spoken as part of the liturgy? I thought his statement about how we offer to make our personal service to Our Lord as part of the liturgy quite provocative. After all, the Liturgy doesn't stop when the Mass is over. We are to take the Gospel and continue it through our liturgical actions (service). His message to us was that stewardship is an action. I believe that stewardship is a result of good liturgy. Good liturgy is a "two way street" in a way because what we bring into it is just as valuable as what we take from it. What we bring to the liturgy helps us to "ite missa est" (go forth), take it out and make it better.

I thought that Jeannette's funeral liturgy was a good liturgy, like so many of our funerals are, (maybe even a great liturgy!) because her family brought into it the love for God, the love for Jeannette, and a love for good liturgy as evidenced by their full participation and the inclusion of Dixieland Jazz to enhance the glorification and salvation of God.

Maybe I should change the title to...It Don't Mean A Thing If It Ain't Got That...Good Liturgy?
