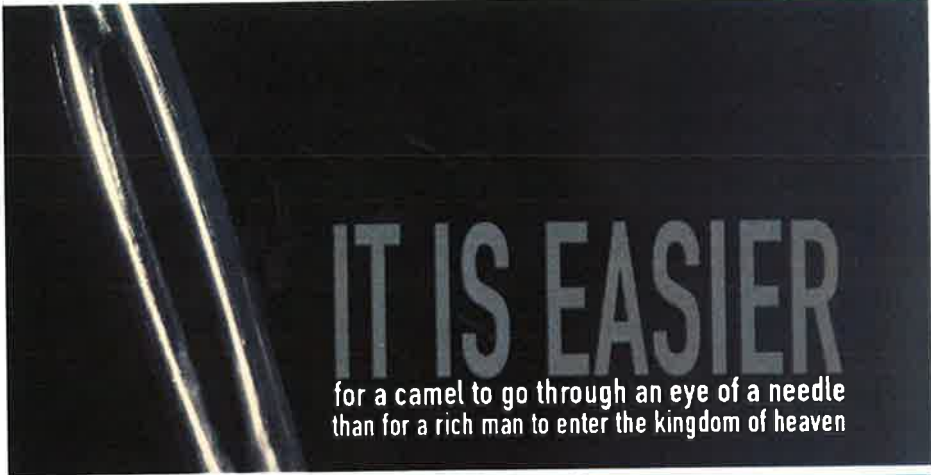

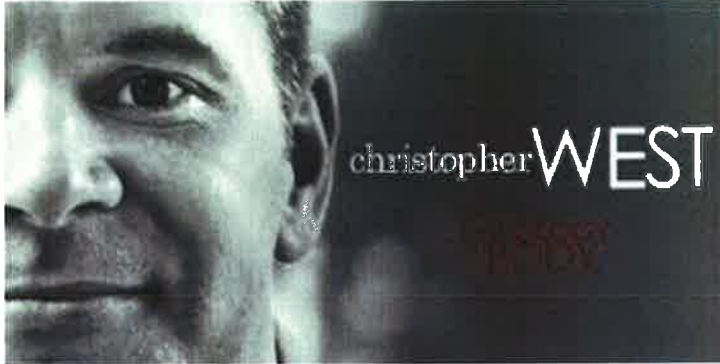

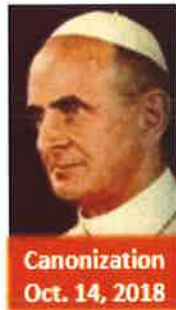

## in the neighborhood



Many people have asked me to explain a little more about what I do as the Minister of Pastoral Neighborhood Outreach. Bishop Ricken announced the updating of parish boundaries in *The Compass* on March 15, 2017. He wrote, "Pope Francis calls on a renewal of 'missionary discipleship' (*Evangelii Gaudium*). As Jesus sent his followers to spread the Gospel message, the Word of God challenges us as believers to 'go forth' into our communities and be involved directly in spreading the love of Christ . . . in the past, boundaries were used as a means to direct people where they cannot worship or become a member. I do not want the boundaries to be used in this way. Let us look to seize this opportunity by allowing our defined boundaries to become parameters of our 'mission field'. It is here in our neighborhoods that we ought to be reaching out first to offer all the people within our mission field the joy and the mercy of the Gospel, just as Jesus did."

My position as Minister of Pastoral Neighborhood Outreach is to help us go out into our neighborhood so we can fulfill our call from Jesus and the Church to walk with and care for all our neighbors in our mission field. The first thing I am doing is learning who our neighbors are through the diocesan software program called, "MissionInsite." It provides demographics and lifestyle and religious belief information on those who reside in our neighborhood. What we are learning is enlightening.

If you look at the back of this handout you will find two maps from MissionInsite. The first plots all our parishioners who attend St. Mary Parish. Each dot is a household. Our households go out to Oshkosh, Greenville, Mackville, Green Bay and Chilton. The second map is our mission field. Eleven percent of our parishioners live here. That means 89% of us, including my family, leave our own neighborhood and travel to worship and grow in a spiritual community where we do not live. St. Joseph Parish has 12% of their parishioners in our shared mission field. The combined total is 262 households out of approximately 5100. That's only 5% of the households in our neighborhood.

Sixty-six percent of our neighbors identify themselves as affiliated with a denomination (37% Catholic, 41% Protestant, 21% Non-denominational, 2% other). Thirty-four percent are not affiliated with any religious congregation or community. When asked why they don't participate, they report: "religious people too judgmental, religion too focused on money, don't believe in God, don't trust religious leaders, don't trust organized religion, disillusionment with religion, strict/inflexible beliefs,

boring/uninteresting, wasn't relevant to my life."

The strongest statement from both groups about belief in God was "God is love and invites the world into a loving relationship." And their top ministry recommendations for a parish were to provide "warm and friendly encounters, sermons of quality, and opportunities for volunteering in the community."

So what do we do? Fifty-one hundred households and 13,000 souls! This mission may feel overwhelming, but I don't think it is. We are already seeing how the Spirit is moving in our parish. Participation in Alpha is growing. The Neighbor 2 Neighbor Committee (formerly Twinning Committee) has refocused on the mission field. Parish Mission Planning is underway, and the Pastoral Leadership Council is guiding the parish to focus on hospitality.

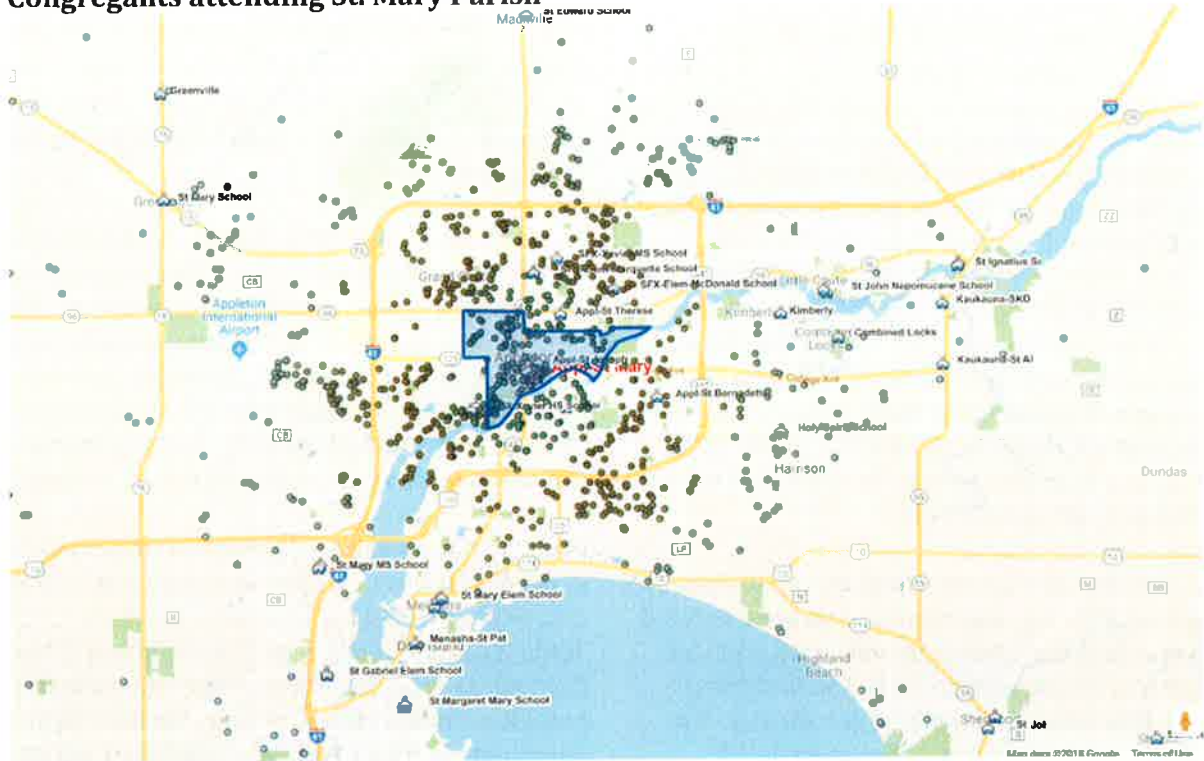
We also have a strong tradition of helping our neighbors in need. Matthew 25 sponsors our Lenten fundraiser. The Human Concerns Committee collects food and needed items throughout the year. The Neighbor 2 Neighbor Committee sponsors the Habitat for Humanity builds and provides meals at the Warming Shelter. Many of us participate in these and other ministries either by giving money or volunteering. But we don't have a chance to invite our neighbors who are helped to be part of our community. To find ways to do this, Fr. Bill and I have been collaborating with the non-profit organizations in our mission field to build stronger relationships with them and our neighbors in their programs.

Next, I hope to reach out to parishioners living in our mission field to help us connect with the rest of our neighbors. I would like to listen to their ideas about how St. Mary can be more present; then follow through with their guidance and all our participation.

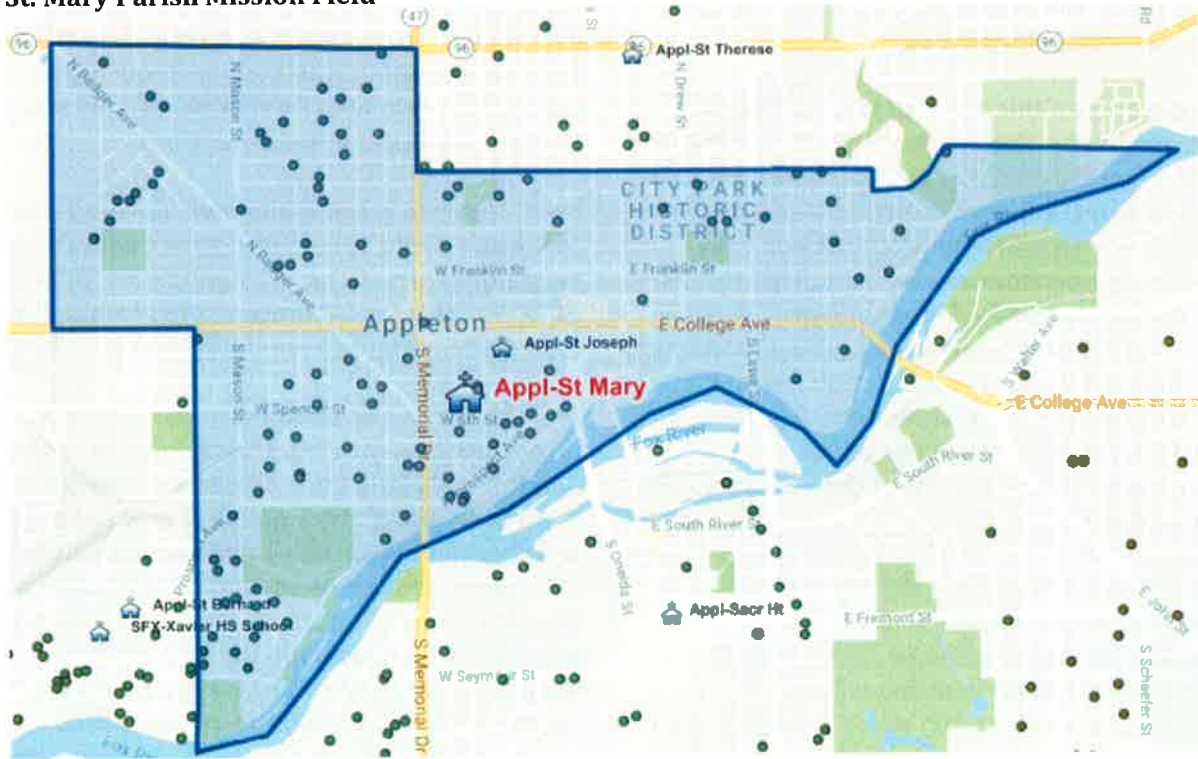
So what can we all do to reach our neighbors? It might be as simple as greeting church neighbors sitting on their porch. Take a little time to learn their names and invite them to an event in the parish. If new people take us up on our invitation, will they find us warm and welcoming? Will we invite them to sit with us at Mass or at Coffee & Donuts? I hope so, because I believe as we go out into our mission field, build relationships, and start to invite our neighbors, they will come looking for a place to belong. Let them find in us a warm and welcoming neighbor who says to them, "I'm so glad you're here. Sit with us and make yourself at home."
