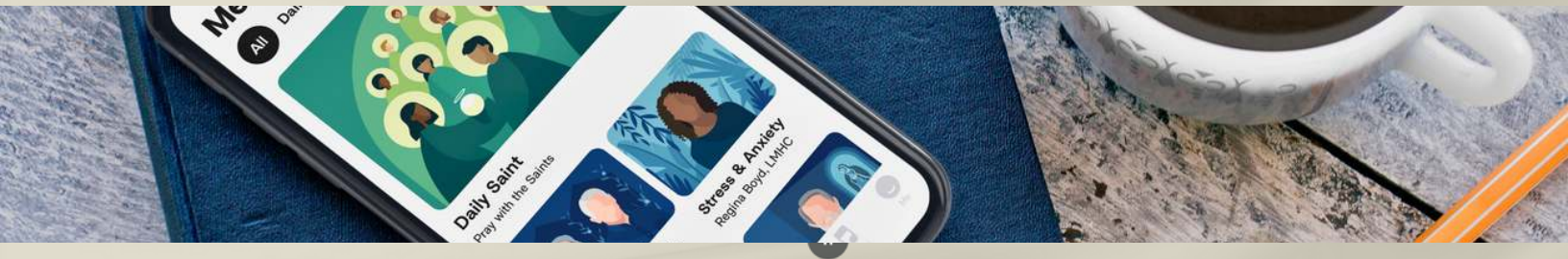

A pig and a cow were conversing in a barnyard. The pig confessed that he was feeling depressed about his lack of popularity. He complained that people were always talking in complimentary terms about the cow's gentleness but never had anything particularly kind to say about him. He admitted that cows give milk and cream, but he was sure that pigs give more.

"Why, we give bacon and ham and pork chops, and people even pickle our feet," he grumbled. "I don't see why you cows are held in such high esteem!"

The cow thought for a moment, then replied gently. "Perhaps it's because we cows are giving while we're living!"

As a way of living, giving or stewardship is integral in the life of a friend and follower of Jesus. You and I cannot be Gospel people if we do not imitate Jesus' unselfish love.

The cow thought for a moment, then replied gently. "Perhaps it's because we cows are giving while we're living!"

Jesus gave everything of Himself, even to the point of spilling the last drop of His Blood from the Tree of the Cross, for love of you and me. All his time and talent, and even the little treasure Jesus had, was given back to His Father from a Heart filled with gratitude. Jesus' joy was to do only what the Father asked of Him.

You and I are gifted with so much. The Lord pours His bountiful blessings over us, again, and again, and again. Sometimes we admit that it is easy to take for granted those blessings or to think that somehow I earned or deserved them. We forget to acknowledge the Lord as the Giver of all Gifts. We can easily forget to offer a prayer of gratitude and a promise to be generous with the gifts received.

How can I repay the LORD for all the great good done for me? (Psalm 116:12)

I like Bishop Robert Morneau's reflection:

Stewardship is about four things: 1) receiving God's gifts gratefully, 2) nurturing and tending those gifts responsibly, 3) sharing those gifts justly and charitably, and 4) returning those gifts to God in abundance.

Might we do some soul-searching? Am I grateful to the Lord? Do I tend responsibly the gifts I have received? Am I careful in how I spend my money or am I frivolous or easily swayed by advertisements? Am I a charitable and just person? Do I make a generous return to the Lord of His gifts to me?

Let me now speak specifically about my treasure, because here is where the rubber meets the road, so to speak, for us followers of Jesus.

In restaurants, my practice is to leave a tip of 20% for the wait staff, realizing that they work so hard for not the biggest of salaries.

Sadly, Catholics contribute about 2% of their annual wages, before taxes, to the Church. Our Protestant sisters and brothers double that for their sacrificial giving.

Abraham, with a heart overflowing with gratitude, came before the priest Melchizedik, bearing a tithe, that is a tenth, of his bountiful harvest.

It does me good to do the math every once in a while in terms of my financial gift to my parish. What is the percentage of my annual sacrificial giving to my parish and other charities when compared to my total annual salary?

When I first started ministry as a priest back in 1983, I believed that I had offered my whole life to the Lord, so I could forgo sacrificial giving. My first Pastor, Father Jack, told me that I thought wrong. So I thought I could lock in a gift of twenty dollars a week for the rest of my life. Again, Fr Jack told me that I thought wrong!

Today, I give my age, \$70, every week to Saint Mary Parish. When the calendar switches over to the New Year, I will give \$71 every week to my parish. I think Fr Jack would be pleased with me!

As we review all things stewardship on these autumn days, I would encourage you to do some soul searching and genuine praying about your sacrificial giving to your LORD and and to your spiritual family of Saint Mary.

Commenting on the rich young man's unwillingness to let go of his treasure, thereby entrusting that treasure to Jesus in order to follow the Lord more closely, Saint Augustine writes in the person of Jesus Himself: *"I received the earth, I will give heaven; I received temporal goods, I will give back eternal goods; I received bread, I will give life... I have been given hospitality, but I will give a home; I was visited when I was sick, but I will give health; I was visited in prison, but I will give freedom. The bread you have given to my poor has been consumed, but the bread I will give will not only refresh you, but will never end."* (Pope Leo XIV, Apostolic Exhortation "Dilexite [I have loved you]," Paragraph 45, 10.4.25)

Thank you for all you are and do for Saint Mary Parish! Let us continue to be ripples of the Lord's love wherever we are!

Let us revisit our Stewardship Prayer which I composed in the Fall of 2020.

Loving Lord God, always with us, you fill us with your Holy Spirit of Love and make us Your Holy partners in the noble and glorious work of building up Your Kingdom on this earth.

Shape our hearts, that we may always give You praise and thanks through our constant awareness of your closeness to us, our gentle service of you in our neighbors near and far, and our generous sharing of our treasure.

May the holy gifts You shower upon us enliven our partnership with You and inspire our better angels of gratitude and generosity wherever we go in Your Name.
