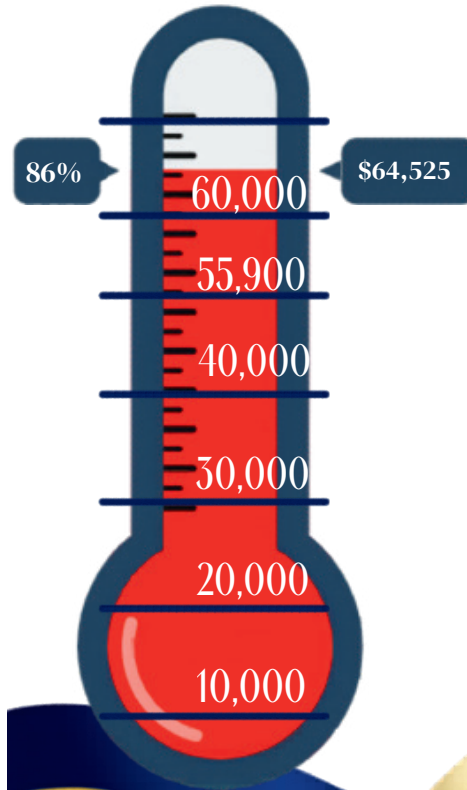

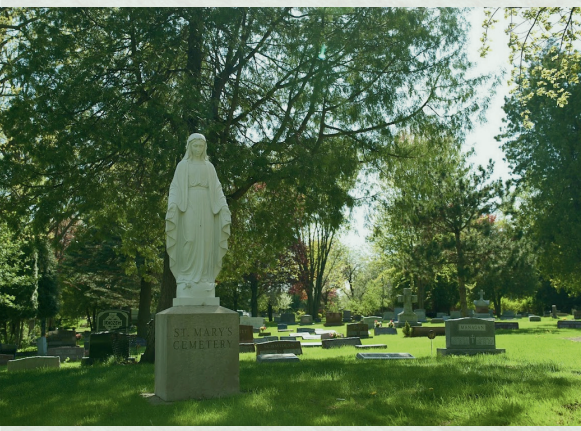

In the midst of a world and nation that seems to have lost their way,
surrounded by so much cruelty and depravity, where the lives of our
least sisters and brothers, innocent and just trying to live normally like
you and me, seem to be tossed aside into a violent void of suffering,

and of even death, we feel for a moment that hope cannot be revived in us. We feel overwhelmed by anger and hatred toward world leaders who have chosen this destruction for us, against our will. We are terrified because of the spiral of violence that just could bring us to an unbridgeable abyss, as Pope Leo warns. We cannot imagine the fear terrorizing our immigrant sisters and brothers, our sisters and brothers who serve in the military and their families, and federal government workers and agents whose consciences are tormented by the unjust orders they are expected to carry out. I cannot imagine the blatant dissonance of nodding my head in agreement to madness, which some politicians find too easy to do.

In Pope Leo's homily for Palm Sunday, I was struck by the bluntness in his words. "Brothers and sisters, this is our God: Jesus, King of Peace, who rejects war, whom no one can use to justify war. Jesus does not listen to the prayers of those who wage war, but rejects them, saying: "Even though you make many prayers, I will not listen: your hands are full of blood" (Is 1:15).

In these worst of times it seems on some days, we wonder if our hope can be revived. Are we trapped in winter darkness? We might catch ourselves crying out with Martha and Mary, in the midst of their grief upon the death of their dear brother, Lazarus, "Lord, if only you had been here..." Or we catch ourselves crying out with our Crucified Jesus, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Easter proclaims that cruelty and depravity, indifference and injustice, violence and hatred, and even death itself, never have the last word. All of this chaos will have no chance of persevering in the light of the Lord Jesus' magnificent love for you and me. Jesus is not indifferent to the waywardness of the human heart that leads to too many atrocities. He is our Great Liberator who frees us from madness. Jesus is our Savior who anoints our breaking hearts with the salve of healing and hope. Nothing can snuff out the power of Jesus or the power of His Victorious Love. All the slings and arrows that we are forced to endure will have no sting whatsoever in the brilliant light of the New Dawn of Easter. The risen Lord always hears the prayers of His righteous people who call out to him, and that definitely includes your prayers and my prayers. The prayers of the unrighteous among us fall on the Lord's deaf ears. Violence and depravity don't stand a chance in the face of the victories of Easter! Believe me when I say that nothing that is of the Evil One can overturn Jesus' victory over sin and death!

Happy Season of Easter to you and your family and friends! Yes, notice the surprise of crocuses popping up amidst dead leaves!

Christ has risen! He has truly risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
