# *in Joy &* **SORROW**

Friday, May 8th, marked the first anniversary of the election of Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost from South Chicago, who took the name Leo XIV, as the 267th Successor of Saint Peter. The word pope is related to the Latin word pontifex, which means bridge builder. As we have experienced the ministry of Pope Leo so far, I see him as being true to his universal role in the Catholic Church. From the moment Pope Leo was introduced to the world on the balcony of Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome, announcing the first words of the Risen Lord Jesus to his disciples, "Peace be with you," the Holy Father has been committed to being the Lord's spokesperson for peace and unity. Leo is not afraid of any earthly power that would challenge his role to be a bridge builder. He is a herald of Jesus and His Gospels. Minimizing crime or crafting foreign policy have nothing to do with his ministry as Pope. Criticizing him for responsibilities he has nothing to do with is complete nonsense and disrespectful.

The majority of cardinal electors who entered the conclave on Wednesday, May 7, 2025 were of one mind and heart that the new Pope would continue the reformations begun by our beloved Pope Francis. Note that 80% of them were created cardinals by Pope Francis. The restructuring of the Curia, the focus on Jesus (God) as the Face of Mercy, the commitment to being a Synodal Church, and

the call to go to the peripheries with the Gospel of Jesus to our sisters and brothers who feel marginalized or alienated are the central- emphases of the pontificate of Pope Francis.

Most of the cardinal electors were convinced that they wanted a new Pope who would be a good listener and a humble pastor in the spirit of Francis.

I am delighted to say that I see all of the above emphases from Francis being lived out in the inaugural ministry of Pope Leo.

What impresses me about the Holy Father are the following:

- He is sincere in his practice of the presence of God. He is close to the Lord and humbly acts as the Lord's instrument.
- Pope Leo is careful in his preaching and teaching. His homilies are not as colorful as Francis' but they are rich in images. I like how he uses language in a poetic way. For example, on Good Shepherd Sunday (4/26), in his homily delivered in front of ten young men about to be ordained priests for ministry in the Diocese of Rome, considering Jesus' announcement *I AM* the sheep's gate, Pope Leo said, "Today more than ever, especially when statistics seem to indicate a divide between people and the Church, keep the door open! Let people in, and be prepared to go out. This is another secret for your life: you are a channel, not a filter. Many believe they already know what lies beyond the threshold. They carry memories with them, perhaps from a distant past. Often, there is something within them that is alive and has not died out; this draws them in. Other times, however, there is something else within them that still bleeds and repels them. The Lord knows, and he waits. Be a reflection of his patience and tenderness. You belong to everyone and are for everyone! Let this be the fundamental purpose of your mission: to keep the threshold open and direct others to it, without using too many words." In all ministry in Jesus' Name, it is critical to always be a channel and not a filter.
- Pope Leo is a down-to-earth person. He likes to cook. He plays tennis. I guess he likes horses. He works out. He is in a whole lot better shape than me, considering Leo is just nine months younger than me. He takes one day off most weeks. I am thinking he knows how to change the oil in a truck! Not me! I might be just as good as he is in solving the daily Wordle puzzle though.
- I love hearing the Holy Father speak in English. He is so natural in switching from speaking in English to Spanish to Italian. That is a gift. With an IQ of 145, Pope Leo is on the threshold of being a genius.
- It was common thinking that there would never be a Pope from the US. Since Father Robert Prevost, and then Bishop Prevost, spent some twenty years as a missionary in Peru and is a citizen of Peru as well as the US, his allegiance to the US is tempered by his closeness to the poor people of the Church in South America.

We know now that what country the Pope comes from is not as important as what kind of a minister he is.

- Pope Leo has a sense of humor. He laughed when he told the Italian tennis superstar that it could turn out badly if they volleyed a tennis ball back and forth in one of the halls of the Apostolic Palace. There are too many priceless art pieces in that place!
- I like that Pope Leo is reintroducing us to the Documents of Vatican Council II at his General Audiences on Wednesdays. These documents still need the Church's attention towards full implementation. The underpinnings for what it means to be a synodal Church are present in the Council documents, and in the Acts of the Apostles, I might add. The Church is the People of God walking together, side by side with its Bishops, listening and learning and loving one another. The Holy Spirit is the energizer of this Church, shaped by Vatican II and Synodality.
- Pope Leo is a son of Saint Augustine. As a member of the Order of Saint Augustine, a worldwide community of men religious, Pope Leo is convinced of the values of peace, unity, and friendship.

Good People, I am just embarking on the adventure of getting to know what makes Pope Leo tick. His theological, spiritual, and pastoral senses impress me! I am grateful to Pope Francis for the gift of Pope Leo, Francis' last surprise to the Universal Church. Just a year ago, Cardinal Robert Prevost was very much in the background when the conclave to elect Francis' successor began! Thank You, Holy Spirit, and thank you, too, Pope Francis, for bringing Leo to us! Remember to join me in praying for our dear Pope Leo XIV!
