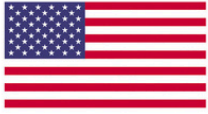


## Moment of Remembrance Cemetery Salutes

Back in the day when Father Robert Prevost of Chicago was ordained a bishop for servant leadership among the People of God in Chiclayo, Peru (Dec 2014), he chose as his episcopal motto In the One [Christ], We Are One.

As the Spiritual Family of Saint Mary Parish accompanied Margie and Allan, and their families and friends, on a heartwrenching journey of hopes lifted and hopes dashed after the horrific car crash on Thursday, April 9, it became obvious that we are one, in the One Christ. What brought us together in prayer for Margie and Alan, what brought us to their bedsides, what got us down on our knees in prayer, what galvanized us to do so much to share in the sufferings of Margie and Alan, was all because we are together a part of the Body of Christ. Jesus never shies away from joining His suffering to our suffering. His Spirit of Compassion joins us to Him and to each other. It is genuine faith that joins our hearts together and makes it possible to accompany one another in life, especially through the bad, sad, and sick times.

I am so blessed to be a part of this Spiritual Family. The care and prayer, so loving, through Margie and Alan's time in the hospital, the careful planning for their joint Funeral Mass, the hospitality of welcome and warmth, with doors held wide open to all who came to express their love for the Hopfensbergers and the Diermeiers, the touching letter to Margie and Alan's family and friends from Bishop David Ricken, the music at the Funeral Mass, and the fellowship at the luncheon were all so beautiful and filled with the grace and glory of the Lord's presence.

Dear Margie was our teacher and witness in showing us what warm hospitality and loving kindness look like. Who she was was inspired by her friendship with Jesus. Every Wednesday, Margie and I would open adoration before the Blessed Sacrament at 4:30 pm. We had our assigned seats in church, if you will. I was in the front pew on the St Mary side and Margie was in the back pew. In the chapel, she always sat closest to the table where the bulletins are made available. Again, I was near the front. During Lent, you would find us both on Saturday at 8 am in the chapel for Adoration.

Margie's friendship with Jesus was genuine and deep. She loved Jesus. She sometimes felt a little less holy because her only brother is a priest and her only sister is a nun. I would say, "Far be that from the truth." Her vocation as a daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother, nurse's aide, and servant minister was genuine evidence to her genuine faith, hope and love. Margie's superlative joy was evidence of her holiness. To be superlative is to be holy.

Truth be told though, Margie could get pretty animated about situations and persons that were less than what she thought they should be. I would caution her, "Now Margie, calm down. Take a few deep breaths. Breathe in the Spirit's peace!" None of us is ever finished with growing in holiness.

I will miss Margie's faithful presence around here. I loved the beautiful dresses she wore to Mass, always in the color of the liturgical year! She had a lot of green editions!

As far as Alan, Margie, who could be persuasive at times, convinced me to purchase a new Honda CRV. I was strongly directed to do that before Alan retired in December 2024! I got in right under the wire!

Alan sat me down at his desk at Gustman Honda and posed one question, whose answer he suggested would determine everything. "Do you want a leather interior or not?" I thought "Why not?" and answered in the affirmative. "There is only one CRV on the lot that fits the bill! Let me go get it!"

After the test drive, not that enthused about the “Urban Grey Pearl” color, I said, “Let’s go for it!” An hour later, the deal was done. Alan reported, “This was my quickest sale ever!” He smiled!

When I remember Margie and Alan, this poem comes to mind. It is one of my favoritest!
