




# DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

Not everyone might agree with me, but living in the Midwest blesses us with the celebration of the change of seasons. Winter, with its unique beauty, gives way to the newness of spring, which moves us into summer where all is growing around us, and with Mother Nature finally worn out, so to speak, we observe autumn. Each season is my favorite.

So as we welcome Spring on Tuesday at 10:06 pm, to be precise, I am happy. I wonder what it would be like to hear the sap begin to creep up the tree trunks? Does a bud make a noise as it bursts open? What about a crocus as it pops through the moist earth? The birds are back serenading us in the morning and in the evening. I am on the lookout for the first spotting of the robin upon its homecoming!

Here is a spring-like poem from e. e. cummings. Forgive the punctuation, which happens to be a quirk of mr cummings!

i thank You God for most this amazing day:for the leaping greenly spirits of trees and a blue true dream of sky;and for everything which is natural which is infinite which is yes

(i who have died am alive again today. and this is the sun's birthday;this is the birth day of life and of love and wings:and of the gay great happening illimitably earth)

how should tasting touching hearing seeing breathing any - lifted from the no of all nothing - human merely being doubt unimaginable You? now the ears of my ears awake and (now the eyes of my eyes are opened)

Lent, which comes from an Old English word that means to lengthen, partners with the coming of Spring and the lengthening of the days in our Northern Hemisphere. Lent, like Spring, should be charged with a deep down freshness, that awakens our spirits to the presence of the Lord in our lives, so close, so tender, so compassionate is Jesus.

Spring training for professional baseball players and spring cleaning for super-conscious moms are apropos images for Lent.

Am I practicing the basics of my friendship with the Lord? Spending time with him, which is prayer. Ridding my life of those stumbling blocks in my relationship with the Lord, which is fasting. And moving out of myself, with a heightened attention to those around me and a deepened commitment to just being kind, which is almsgiving.

How am I spring cleaning my heart? Might I feel the Lord nudging me to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession or Penance) during Lent. Remember that the Church lights are being kept on for you on Monday of Holy Week, March 25, from 6 to 9 pm! And on Saturday morning (3/16! and 3/23), the Sacrament will be celebrated at 9 am in the Parish Office.

As we have marked the midpoint in the holy season of Lent, the daily Scripture for Mass hones in on the Gospel of John. Now is the time to move off of ourselves and to focus on Jesus, the Son of God. He is all about touching people's hearts with his encouraging and challenging words and embracing broken bodies and spirits with his tender, healing touch. Jesus is the Savior. His touch is gentle upon our lives, like the careful application of a salve or ointment. The words *savior* and *salve* are related to each other.

Given all of our feeble and half-hearted attempts at prayer, fasting, and works of charity, we come to realize that we really need saving. You and I will never save ourselves. We need Jesus to do that!
