In Search of New Resurrections by Ann Weems in her wonderful little book, Kneeling in Jerusalem

We in the church are in danger of becoming a tearless people, unable to rage even in a starless abyss. We have imitated a smiling society, glossing over the hurt, the oppression, the peacelessness on earth, or we have become caustic and cynical and despairing, insisting on looking the other way as our church members crawl to the altar, the scraps of their lives in their arms.

We were created for covenant keeping and yet, we are in danger of becoming a blindhearted people, buying into the system, placing our hope with kings and corporations. Have we not seen?

Have we not heard?

We persist in clinging
to the way things are,
or eagerly placing our faith
in the newest religious fad,
the latest book on how-to Christianity
(in ten easy steps),
or the current slogans
presented as though they were
the Word of God.
We are programming and papering ourselves
into perpetuity,
and rationalizing and excusing
our immortality.

We spend our energy in complaining, gloomingly forecasting our future together. We panic for positions in employment and committee, with each special interest group

vying for the first place in the kingdom. Perhaps it's time for remembering that Jesus stood in the Jordan to be baptized with the others, long ago casting his lot, not with the good church people, but with the poor wherever that poverty might emerge. His name is Emmanuel, and yet, individually and corporately, we have named him "GOD-WITH-ME." Have we not seen? Have we not heard? In the light of the cross, the alternative is anything but hopelessness. On the contrary! There is every scriptural indication that we are called to change into the kingdom of God. Where change is possible, new resurrections loom!

Pope Francis' lament in July of 2013, the first year of his pontificate, piercing the skies over the Island of Lampedusa, the Gateway into Europe for so many of our immigrant and refugee sisters and brothers from northern Africa and the Middle East, was starkly, "Have we forgotten how to cry for our suffering brothers and sisters? Have we lost the gift of tears?"

Here is the great danger:

The notion of "GOD-WITH-ME" may foster a tendency to create the Lord God in my own image and likeness. I shape my God to match my viewpoint or perspective. Somehow my loyalty to this or that looms over my loyalty to the Lord. Just possibly patriotism or nationalism or prosperity or supremacy can become my idol, replacing the Lord God.

Finally, we all know that Emmanuel is translated "GOD-WITH-US." Resurrection experiences surprise us and happen whenever we put the Kingdom of God first in our lives. The Kingdom of God is the Community of the Beloved. The Beloved is the Risen Lord Jesus. The Beloved is Us. There can be no "us versus them" in the Community of the Beloved. We choose to row together all on the same boat to avoid the peril of drowning. We are saved together.

When we embrace this perspective, then resurrection experiences will multiply and become as infinite as the stars in the dark night sky!
