

As I get older, I notice a waning in my spirit of adventure. I like to be at home. That being said, my pilgrimage to Italy for the World Meeting of Parish Priests for the Synod, held from Monday through Thursday, April 29 - May 2, was incredible!

First, thank you for all your love and support. You were maybe more excited about this meeting than me! I appreciate so very much all the notes, the gifts of travel money, the clergy shirts monogrammed with our parish logo, the members of our spiritual family who were at my house to send me off to Rome on Friday (5/26), all the well-wishing posters, those who took me by car to and picked me up from O'Hare Airport in Chicago, the upgrade of my airline ticket to first class, those who welcomed me home on Saturday (5/4), and those who patiently waited for me to celebrate the 7:45 am Sunday Mass, as our help out priest was a no-show. The applause was a great welcome.

From the onset, I have reminded you that my representation at this world summit on synodality in Rome was a tribute to our Saint Mary Parish Spiritual Family. We have taken seriously Pope Francis' call to become a synodal parish that is welcoming and serious about walking alongside one another, listening with the *ear of the heart* (as the Rule of Saint Benedict suggests), and trusting that the Spirit is at work in every person.

A key piece of the experience in Rome happened around tables set up according to language groups, namely, English, Spanish, Italian and French. In my group, priests came from the US (yours truly), Italy, Australia, England, Japan, Oman, Lebanon, South Korea, Kenya and Nigeria.

I learned that the community in Oman (West Asia) is composed of Catholics who celebrate Mass in ten or so different rites. Some of these communities have the opportunity to celebrate Mass only once a month. Keep that in mind when I guesstimate that we, in the Catholic Community of Appleton, have about twenty-five Masses on a single weekend!

I learned that the Catholic Community in Beirut (Lebanon) is a small, suffering community, in the aftermath of the explosion in 2020 that resulted in the destruction of one of the community's churches.

I learned that the Church in Africa struggles with such ideas as raising up women to leadership roles in the church, possibly to the diaconate, and outreach to the members of the LGBTQ+ community.

I learned that a young priest in the Diocese of Leeds, England, pastoring two parishes, is overwhelmed as there is no senior leadership team. As a result, this young priest prepares the parish bulletin and pays the bills! Imagine that!

On Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday mornings, we began our ten-hour day with Lauds (Morning Prayer), which was in Latin. I don't know, for sure, that it was Latin, but I do know, for sure, that I had no clue what our community was praying!

Following prayer, the theme of the day was presented. There were theologians present who gave input. Then we spent the next two hours or so in conversation in the Spirit.

Conversation in the Spirit is one of the gifts that the synodal way has presented to the universal Church. This format is meant to create space for the working of the Holy Spirit. There is a Scripture passage that guides the experience, followed by a reading of the question for discussion, followed by seven minutes of silence. Then each member seated at the table has four minutes to speak to the theme of the day. This time is followed by another seven minutes of silence when members reflect on what they heard or what maybe was a new idea for them. Again, space is made for the Holy Spirit to speak to hearts. The follow up allows two minutes from each person. Then there is about 45 minutes or so to begin formulating a group response to the question for the day.

Following lunch, usually soup, bread, deli meats, garden salad, and fruit, there is a 2-hour break (this includes the time for lunch), then we are back together in the conference room. This is a long session, where some of the groups are invited to share their summary reports with the large group, followed by observations from the theologians. I was very intrigued by the creative and challenging input from the *experts*!

Mass followed at about 6:45 pm and supper at 8 pm. I must confess that I skipped supper a couple of times.

I will follow up this recap with more in the coming weeks. Stay tuned!
