The Office of the Synod suggested that I ask Pope Francis the last question on my list. This is significant because the Holy Father is aware that the US Bishops have two very important irons in the fire at the same time, those irons being a revival of the People of God's reverence for the Eucharist across our land and the Pope's encouragement to become a synodal Church. With my question, I was hoping to make a connection between the two.

Pope Francis zeroed in on the connection between Eucharist and the synodal keys of communion, participation and mission. The Eucharist is the source of the graces that raise up all worshiping believers to take seriously their role in the Church. We are the One Body of Christ! The participation of the whole is enhanced when every individual participates! The Eucharist is all about mission, going out into the world, emboldened by the Holy Spirit to share the Good News!

After the two-hour audience with the Holy Father, the parish priests headed over to St Peter's Basilica for Mass at the Altar of the Chair of Saint Peter. Cardinal Mario Grech, who is the Secretary General of the Office of the Synod of Bishops, presided at the Mass. Cardinal Grech's homily was in Italian. With the help of Sister Marie Kolbe Zamora, who works for the Office of the Synod of Bishops, who facilitated our Parish Synod on the Eve of Pentecost in 2021, and who sent me her notes of the homily in English, Cardinal Grech keyed in on the remarkable role of the Holy Spirit in the Synod of Jerusalem, which took place at the beginning of the Church's story. Discerning the direction of the Holy Spirit never rests in a single person. The arrogant pastor who thinks he has a monopoly on the guidance of the Holy Spirit is dangerous. Mutual listening among many people, "listening with the ear of the heart (Saint Benedict), only this assures the People of God of the Spirit's direction.

Cardinal Grech also spoke of the necessity of joy in the synodal process. Living the Gospel is all about joy. Joy results when you and I experience the Lord's unconditional love in our lives and remain in that love! The synodal pathway always takes us along the way of joy!

I take this away with me from my experience of these days in Rome shared with priests from throughout the world. In the retreat conducted by Fr Timothy Radcliffe, O.P., which preceded the Fall Session of the Synod on Synodality last October, he said, "A collegiality of affectivity always precedes a collegiality of effectivity."

Conversation in the Spirit always draws us closer to one another. This is the work of the Spirit, always to break down barriers and build bridges. We may not always agree with one another but we always hold in our hearts a high positive love for each other. Differences always give way to love for the Lord and each other!

I would like to wrap up this review of my experience at the World Meeting of Parish Priests for the Synod, which was held in Rome from May 29 through May 2. Having finished the work of the meeting on Wednesday, nearly 200 priests from 98 countries were up at the crack of dawn on Thursday (5/2) for a quick breakfast, so as to be ready to board coach buses at 7:15 am to take us from the retreat center to the Vatican. Lots of traffic at the time of day heading into Rome!

We then made our way to the Paul VI Audience Hall and found our seats in a theater on the second floor where we waited for our audience with Pope Francis, which was scheduled for 10 am.

Priests who hoped to ask Pope Francis a question had submitted their questions by Tuesday afternoon, and after vetting the questions, eight priests were selected to participate in the Q & A with Pope Francis. You can bet that I was ready. Here is the list of questions that I submitted:

- Holy Father, thank you for your focus on mercy as the face of Jesus and the face of the Church. I recall thousands and thousands of young people in Lisbon chanting Todos! Todus! Todos! All are included within the Lord's merciful Love. Mercy within mercy within mercy. How does the Lord's justice fit into this? And am I always needing to say to people, "Go and sin no more?"
- Holy Father, you speak often of the dangers of worldliness, of clericalism, or being rigid or too certain. I admit that I see this is some of our seminarians and young priests. How do we address this?
- Holy Father, thank you so much for your courageous ministry of bringing a new integrity to the Vatican. I don't know how many times you have cautioned all of us to avoid gossiping. When I am tempted in this way, I think of you. Bringing reform to the Vatican is a tall order but you are doing it. How do you remain so positive and joyful through all of this?
- Holy Father, how can I help my Bishop to become more and more a synodal Bishop? He is doing his very best!
- Holy Father, thank you for reminding us parish priests again and again to be close to the
 people, always tender and compassionate for this is the style of Jesus! This does me much
 good. I am sure you are well aware that the US is in the midst of a Eucharistic Revival. Tens of
 thousands of people are registered to attend a Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July.
 What would you say to help us make a closer link between the Eucharist and the synodal
 Church?
