UPDATE ON BRETT JEDWABNY

On July 9th, Brett Jedwabny, a student from Appleton North, experienced a tragic accident at home involving a power washer. He received urgent medical care locally before being transferred to Children's Hospital Milwaukee.

Since the incident, Brett has been on the road to recovery. In late October, he underwent a cranioplasty, which involved placing a titanium plate on the right side of his skull. He has been participating in various therapies to regain his speech and mobility. On November 9, Brett was able to receive communion for the first time since his accident, marking a truly special moment. Please continue to keep Brett and his family in your thoughts and prayers as he heals.

Brett's parents have been devising ways for him to work on his academic skills and are requesting that people send him cards. For every card Brett receives at the Shirley Ryan AbilityLab, he will read it and color in the corresponding state on a map. Additionally, he will keep a tally of which state sends the most cards.

ST. MARY PARISH-APPLETON

WITH FR. BILL SWICHTENBERG

Through the years, I have written about the clarion call from the People of God that our Church be more welcoming towards our sisters and brothers who are members of the LGBTQ+ community. Back in June, in this forum, I wrote about how this concern has been presented again and again throughout the three-year Synod Experience initiated by Pope Francis in the Fall of 2021.

As a communicator, I feel that at times I must sound like a broken record. But in order to touch many hearts with the Gospel message, I have to communicate, communicate, and communicate some more. In addition, partnering with you as fellow baptized believers, the Synodal Pathway invites us to walk side by side, doing our best to bring about the inbreaking of the Reign of God, listening to each other as we share our experiences of the Lord's closeness, then listening, and listening some more with the ears of our heart.

This is a careful study of the Synod documents, summarizing the hopes and dreams of the People of God for our LGBTQ+ sisters and brothers. For those of you who receive this bulletin column as a hard copy, let me know and I can get the June column to you in that format if you want. I would encourage you to have a look at this review again, if you don't remember reading it back in June!

One of the roadblocks to good communication is disinformation or misinformation or "alternative facts."

To add to this timely discussion, I would like to caution you if you believe that the following statement is true: *The Church can dismiss any employee who is supportive of a member of the LGBTQ+ community.* <u>The above statement is not</u> <u>true. This does not happen. This can never be a</u> <u>ground for dismissal of an employee of the Church.</u>

Because every employee who serves in a Catholic Parish or School is considered a "minister," she or he is bound by the Code of Conduct that most Catholic dioceses present for the new minister's signature before employment. This Code of Ethics, if you will, serves as a thorough review of the Church's teaching as contained in the <u>Catechism</u> <u>of the Catholic Church.</u> I wish to call your attention to the following three paragraphs in the Catechism:

<u>2357</u> Homosexuality refers to relations between men or between women who experience an exclusive or predominant sexual attraction toward persons of the same sex. It has taken a great variety of forms through the centuries and in different cultures. Its psychological genesis remains largely unexplained. Basing itself on Sacred Scripture, which presents homosexual acts as acts of grave depravity, tradition has always declared that "homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered." They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complementarity. Under no circumstances can they be approved.

2358 The number of men and women who have deep-seated homosexual tendencies is not negligible. This inclination, which is objectively disordered, constitutes for most of them a trial. They must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard should be avoided. These persons are called to fulfill God's will in their lives and, if they are Christians, to unite to the sacrifice of the Lord's Cross the difficulties they may encounter from their condition.

<u>2359</u> Homosexual persons are called to chastity. By the virtues of self-mastery that teach them inner freedom, at times by the support of disinterested friendship, by prayer and sacramental grace, they can and should gradually and resolutely approach Christian perfection.

I have highlighted in bold the church's stance to be modeled in accompanying our gay and transgendered sisters and brothers. They must be accepted with respect, compassion and sensitivity. This is the teaching of the Church. It is far afield to suggest that the gift of eternal life is denied to a gay person. This is a cruel and self-righteous statement that should never, ever, come from forth from the mouth and heart of a follower of Jesus. This is especially true when we are with our young people, who are so precious to us and who should experience loving acceptance from us. We must go to every length to assure them that they are the Beloved of the Lord, just as they are, as Pope Francis says!

Sadly, many in the LGBTQ+ community do not experience a tender accompaniment by the Church and some Catholics and, as a consequence, have left the Church and taken their families and friends with them. This should sadden you as it saddens me.

I can also report that the language identifying homosexual acts (or inclinations or tendencies) as "objectively (or intrinsically) disordered" is deeply hurtful to our LGBTQ+ members. The Catechism states that the sexual act is disordered and **not the person**, yet this is not what a gay person hears. She or he may hear, "I am disordered." I know that Synod delegates and some bishops have expressed concern about this language.

On these days of heightened anxiety for our LGBTQ+ sisters and brothers, let us pray that they may experience our respect, compassion and sensitivity.
