

ST. MARY PARISH-APPLETON 12.08.2024

WITH FR. BILL SWICHTENBERG

We celebrate a banner Second Week of Advent as we look to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Son of God and the Son of Man, and Mother of the Church. Alongside the great Prophets, Isaiah and John the Baptist, Mary helps us enter into the Mystery which is Advent. During her unplanned pregnancy, Mary is a model of trust, watching and waiting, hoping against all hope that everything would be well. The Conception of Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit, was a quandary for her and her spouse-to-be, Joseph. Remember that they were only engaged at this point. The angel Gabriel's message packed a solid punch that would make their lives difficult to explain to their families and friends. The rumor mill would have been fierce and brutal. Even Joseph would have been urged to report his fiancee for committing the sin of infidelity, punishable by being stoned to death.

I love this poem which captures the spirit of the Annunciation of the Lord Jesus. It is titled "In the KItchen," by Fr Killian McDonnell, OSB. Pause for a moment, take a couple of deep breaths, and ask the Holy Spirit to be with you. What strikes you as you pray this poem?

Giotto* got it wrong. I was not kneeling on my red satin cushion in a shaft of light, head slightly bent. Actually I had just come back from the well. Placing the pitcher on the table I bumped against the edge spilling the water on the floor. As I bent down to wipe it up suddenly a glow as though someone had opened the door

to the sun. Rag in hand, hair across my face, I turned to see who was coming in uninvited, unannounced. All I saw was a light bright against the wall. A voice. You will conceive the Son of the Most High who will save Israel. I stood afraid. Someone closed to the door and I dropped the rag.

A number of things strike me: (1) The Lord is always drawing near to us, indeed, in the most ordinary events of our daily lives. It is so easy to not be paying attention to His closeness! (2) Is it necessary to make a distinction between the profane and the sacred? Is it not so that all around us and all within us are charged with the sacred? (3) For some reason, I like the phrase "light bright" rather than "bright light." I remember us as kids, on Christmas morning, receiving a "Light Brite Set" from Santa. You created a picture with different colored bulbs, like "paint by number" but using bulbs instead. When you turned on the light which was inside the unit, your picture came alive with light.

On Monday, December 9, we celebrate the Solemn Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. Beware, though, because just above I described the Immaculate Conception of Jesus. Monday's feast celebrates the Conception of Mary in the womb of her mother, Anne. During the pregnancy and after, Joachim was there every step of the way to love and support his wife and his daughter.

The mystery of Mary's Conception was proclaimed as an infallible teaching of the Roman Catholic Church by Pope Pius IX in 1854. Because of Mary's upcoming holy role to become the Mother of God, the Church proclaims that no stain of original sin ever touched her. The grace of Jesus' Passion and Death, saving us all from sin forever, was applied to Mary all those years even before Jesus' Death. The phrase prevenient grace in the Prayer over the Gifts at this Feast's Mass captures this mystery.

Then on Thursday, December 12, the Church remembers Our Lady of Guadalupe (She who crushes the serpent of stone.) This is a huge feast among our Hispanic sisters and brothers. On December 9, 1531, on a hill called Tepeyac, just outside Mexico City, Mary appeared to the peasant farmer, Saint Juan Diego. He was on his way to daily Mass. Mary, appearing as a Mestizo companion, dressed in the robes of an Aztec princess, requested that Juan Diego go to the Bishop to report that Our Lady of Guadalupe wanted a basilica to be constructed on that hill.

This is the dialogue between Juan and Mother Mary, so beautiful:

Juan Diego: I beg you, entrust your mission to one of the important persons who is well known, respected, and esteemed. You know I am a nobody, a nothing...You have sent me to walk in places where I do not belong.

Our Lady: My dear little son, let nothing discourage you, nothing depress you. Am I not here who am your Mother? Are you not in the folds of my mantle, in the crossing of my arms? Is there anything else you need?

Mary, a brave and relentless advocate of our sisters and brothers who are poor, oppressed, and pushed to the side by the powerful and rich of the world, is not some meek and mild, plaster-of-Paris-like statue, all gussied up in flowing blue satin robes. No, not at all! Mary is an undaunted Mother, fierce and always standing on the side of our marginal sisters and brothers.

On Our Lady of Guadalupe's Feast, let us pray:

- O God, you choose the little ones of the world to confound the mighty. Give us true humility of spirit...Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.
- The image of the Mother and your Son was imprinted on the garment of Saint Juan Diego with features of his race. Imprint within us a fearless acceptance of all races and peoples... Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.
- In Jesus, the Incarnate Word, you have shown us that you are ever close to us. Have mercy on the downtrodden, our immigrant sisters and brothers across this land, the abused and neglected of the world ... Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.
- Through Saint Juan Diego, you showed your love for the simple and the humble. Forgive us the injustices imposed on native peoples of the earth and redress the wrongs they have suffered...Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us. (These prayers are taken from the People's Companion to the Breviary, the Carmelite Sisters of Indianapolis, 1971)

Lord God, may we who rejoice in Our Lady of Guadalupe live united and at peace in this world until the day of the Lord dawns in glory. We make our prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.
