

Question
Who was the
longest reigning
Pope in history?



I am the door of the sheepfold by Rev Malcolm Guite

Not one that's gently hinged or deftly hung,
Not like the ones you planed at Joseph's place,
Not like the well-oiled openings that swung
So easily for Pilate's practiced pace,
Not like the ones that closed in Mary's face
From house to house in brimming Bethlehem,
Not like the one that no man may assail,
The dreadful curtain, The forbidding veil
That waits your breaking in Jerusalem.

Not one you made but one you have become: Load-bearing, balancing, a weighted beam To bridge the gap, to bring us within reach Of your high pasture. Calling us by name, You lay your body down across the breach, Yourself the door that opens into home.

In the story of our Israelite sisters and brothers, as recounted in the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament), a time of grace from the Lord was observed every fifty years. Every fifty years, this Jubilee time was like a reset button for the covenant relationship between God and God's People. It meant that all debts were to be forgiven; land that was procured, sometimes by seedy means, was to be returned to its original owners; and slaves were to be freed. The Jubilee was a vivid reminder that every relationship is sometimes in need of renewal.

The Roman Catholic Church is celebrating a Jubilee Year in 2025. Note that the last Jubilee was in 2000, at the beginning of the third millennium. Interesting to note however, that Pope Francis declared an Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in 2016.

All of Rome is geared up to welcome millions of pilgrims in this Ordinary Jubilee Year. A ceremonial moment of great grace is when the Holy Father opens the Jubilee Door of Saint Peter's Basilica. This Holy Door will be closed at the end of the Jubilee Year on January 6, 2026, and remain locked until 2050. I remember a feeble Saint Pope John Paul II presiding at this ritual in 2000. He was vested in a beautiful many-colored cope [like the technicolor dream coat of Joseph, son of Jacob], which Pope Francis should have gone on a search for so that he could have worn it when he opened the Jubilee Door on Christmas Eve. Standing outside the opened Door, and looking into the Basilica, is a beautiful sight to behold.

In his Urbi et Orbi Message (to the City [of Rome] and the World) on Christmas morning, Pope Francis said, Brothers and sisters, the door of God's heart is always open; let us return to him! Let us go back to the heart that loves and forgives us! Let us be forgiven by him; let us be reconciled with him! God always forgives! God forgives everything. Let us allow ourselves to be forgiven by God.

This is the meaning of the Holy Door of the Jubilee, which I opened last night here in Saint Peter's Basilica: it represents Jesus, the Door of salvation open for all. Jesus is the Door; the Door that the Father of mercies has opened in the midst of our world, in the midst of history, so that all of us can return to him. We are all like lost sheep; we need a Shepherd and a Door to return to the house of the Father. Jesus is that Shepherd; Jesus is the Door.

Brothers and sisters, do not be afraid! The Door is open, the door is wide open! There is no need to knock on the door. It is open. Come! Let us be reconciled with God, and then we will be reconciled with ourselves and able to be reconciled with one another, even our enemies. God's mercy can do all things. It unties every knot; it tears down every wall of division; God's mercy dispels hatred and the spirit of revenge. Come! Jesus is the Door of Peace.

Often we halt at the threshold of that Door; we lack the courage to cross it, because it challenges us to examine our lives. Entering through that Door calls for the sacrifice involved in taking a step forward, a small sacrifice. Taking a step towards something so great calls us to leave behind our disputes and divisions, and surrender ourselves to the outstretched arms of the Child who is the Prince of Peace. This Christmas, at the beginning of the Jubilee Year, I invite every individual, and all peoples and nations, to find the courage needed to walk through that Door, to become pilgrims of hope, to silence the sound of arms and overcome divisions!

Let me conclude with Pope Francis' Prayer for Jubilee 2025:

Father in heaven,
may the faith you have given us
in your son, Jesus Christ, our brother,
and the flame of charity enkindled
in our hearts by the Holy Spirit,
reawaken in us the blessed hope
for the coming of your Kingdom.
May your grace transform us
into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel.
May those seeds transform from within both
humanity and the whole cosmos
in the sure expectation

of a new heaven and a new earth,
when, with the powers of Evil vanquished,
your glory will shine eternally.
May the grace of the Jubilee
reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope,
a yearning for the treasures of heaven.
May that same grace spread
the joy and peace of our Redeemer
throughout the earth.
To you our God, eternally blessed,
be glory and praise for ever.

Amen.
